It is used for the treatment of the following skin diseases: psoriasis, lichen planus, seborrheic dermatitis, eczema, various genesis and localization (including eczema in children), atopic dermatitis, itching of various origins, allergic skin disease, discoid lupus erythematosus, burns of I degree, sunburn, insect bites.

Some medical conditions may interact with fluocinolone cream. Tell your doctor or pharmacist if you have any medical conditions, especially if any of the following apply to you:

- if you are pregnant, planning to become pregnant, or are breastfeeding
- if you are taking any prescription or nonprescription medicine, herbal preparation, or dietary supplement
- · if you have allergies to medicines, foods, or other substances
- · if you have measles, chickenpox, or tuberculosis
- if you have hardening or thinning of the skin or a skin infection
- if you have recently been vaccinated or you have had a positive tuberculin skin test
